

Mrs. Quador Dead

Elizabeth May Riley was born in Princeton, Illinois, July 5, 1866 and passed away in Danbury, Nebraska, February 15, 1929, aged 62 years, 7 months, and 10 days.

At the age of 15 years she came with her parents to Fremont, Nebraska, where she lived for a time, later moving to Rawlins County, Kansas, and then to Red Willow County, Nebraska, where she has since resided.

On October 4, 1900 she was united in marriage to Amos Quador at McCook, Nebraska. To this union three children were born, Herman L. of Sidney, Nebraska, Alta Orr of Waterloo, Nebraska, and Charlie L. of Indianola, Nebraska, all of whom survive.

In early childhood she suffered from an attack of infantile paralysis and although her life was spared, yet this dreaded disease impaired her health and left her crippled for life. Thus handicapped she was confined largely to her home yet she bore her lot in life without murmuring or complaint. While her acquaintance was thus limited to a few near neighbors, yet all those who know her loved and admired her for her patience and fortitude as well as for her kindly appreciative spirit.

Last May she suffered an attack of pernicious anemia and although every effort was made to relieve her yet it was of no avail. She bore her sufferings, as she had endured the hardships of life, without complaint and the end came quietly and peacefully early Friday morning.

Handicapped as she was in life she seldom had opportunity to attend church services and though she never openly affiliated herself with the church of her choice, yet she had openly confessed a saving faith in Christ and knew the way of life. Besides her husband and three children, she leaves to mourn a sister, Mrs. Anna Barney of Hunnewell, Kansas, and two brothers, William Riley also of Hunnewell, Kansas, and George Riley of Pacific Grove, California, besides five grandchildren.

Funeral services were at the home at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon and interment was made in the Lebanon cemetery.
